Pupil Premium Allocation:

Impact of the Pupil Premium for the Academic Year 2015/16

The pupil premium provides funding for children:

- who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (£1320 per child)
- who have been previously looked after, subject of a special guardianship order and/ or adopted from care (£1900 per child)
- whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300 per child)

Schools are held accountable for the spending of these monies, performance tables will capture the achievement of disadvantaged children covered by the Pupil Premium.

Mellor St Mary, Church of England Primary School is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring vital support is in place for our disadvantaged children to improve their academic outcomes.

How the Pupil Premium was spent in 2015/16

- 1:1 and small group reading support with Teaching Assistants
- 1:1 and small group mathematics support (various programmes)
- Extra-Curricular enrichment activities (sport)
- Music Tuition and resource loans
- Educational Visits
- AGT Mathematics and Reading MOBSS cluster events
- TA support for 1 IPRA pupil
- Childcare costs (breakfast and after school club)
- Milk / snack costs

Early Years Foundation Stage (Reception Class)

- There were 20 children in the cohort with 80% achieving a good level of development. This is above the national average (66.3% of children achieved a good level of development in 2015).
- There were 0 pupils who were entitled to FSM in this cohort.

**Year 1
Phonics**

- There were 20 children in the cohort with 90 % meeting the required standard in the Phonic Screening Check. This is above the national average (81% of children achieved the standard in 2016).
- There were 2 pupils who were entitled to FSM in the cohort. Care must be taken when analysing small numbers.
- All of the Pupil Premium children met the required phonic screening standard.
