Light Reflections...The Gospel **“Let your light shine...” (Matthew 5.16)**

It is slightly strange to think it has been less than a week since the installation. This time a week ago my family had finished arriving, the last boxes were being unpacked and moved, and the last bits of furniture were being assembled. I was full of a nervous energy. Not quite sure what to expect in the coming days. I was hopeful, prayerful but nervous too. A year ago, all I knew about the benefice were road signs from driving along the A59. I had just begun my curacy placement in a different context and the end of curacy, let alone first incumbency, felt a long way off. Even on Sunday morning it did not seem quite real that by the end of the day I would be a vicar, a real actual vicar. Even though I had spent years discerning, praying and working toward that afternoon it did not seem quite real until I was actually at St Leonard's Balderstone, robed and walking into the church.



At that point it did feel real. But the nerves were still there. Though that was probably, in some ways, a good thing. Nerves can be scary, but they can also show what we view as important, what we think matters. I was nervous because I knew this next step in my ministry was and is important. But in church on Sunday, from the first moment I arrived, I was reminded that I will not be doing this ministry alone.

I was blown away by the number of people there. Clergy from other parishes, people from across the benefice and from my curacy parish. I am not sure there were many seats left in the whole church. It was an important reminder that the ministry of the parish is not mine alone, that whatever happens, we will face it supporting and caring for one another. And we face it with God supporting us as well. In the service we were fed by word and sacrament, we heard scripture and received the Body and Blood of Christ.

Sunday was a wonderful day of people gathered in prayer, celebration and support. Our support for one another is not just limited to great days and new beginnings, just as God's presence with us is not limited to feasts and Sunday. As we move forward together as a benefice, as those about to be confirmed prepare for Sunday, how can we all support one another in growing to be the people God calls us to be? How can we give that support and encouragement every day to those around us?

Balderstone Brambles, Brekkie and Buildings!

There are lots of new ventures to celebrate at Balderstone this term – new vicar, new breakfast club, new Bramble nursery, new Open the Book pilot and new building projects!

The launch of our new universal, breakfast club from 8am every day has been a real blessing to Balderstone. We applied to be one of the government's early adopters of free breakfast club to trial the new offer for parents and **WE LOVE IT!** Every day, the children get a **free**, freshly prepared and healthy brekkie (choice of cereals, beans, scrambled eggs, yoghurt and granola) and then get time to be heard read, learn traditional board games and then have a wake up and shake up, keep fit session with one of our sports coaches! With over 60 children on average coming into school for brekkie, it has become a highlight of the school day. We have also noted the benefit to our children to the start of their learning – as the children are fully fuelled and exercised and ready to start the day. Parents and carers have also loved the ability to drop off and get to work – all free of charge.



OUR NEW READ, FED AND GET AHEAD BREAKFAST PROVISION



In April it was also announced by the Department for Education that we have been successful in our bid to expand our school-based nursery offer. This means that over the summer holidays we will be completely refurbishing our EYFS unit, extending the classroom to create three distinct learning and playing spaces – a newly resourced EYFS classroom for our 15 Reception children, a brand new 2-year-old room (Balderstone Brambles Nursery) and a new pre-school room (Balderstone Burrow). We will only be

opening initially to 5, two-year-old children and this provision will grow each year! The success of the bid also means that we will be able to expand our pre-school offer to the parish, offering 15 places for 3–4 year-olds. It is an absolute joy to see our pre-school and Reception children learning through play together and seeing them flourish, especially in their Forest Friday and Woods Wednesday sessions. Here they are planting their own potatoes with Mrs Riddell. Contact Mrs Oddie at school if you would be interested in a place in either Brambles Nursery or Pre-school.



We have also been blessed by a diocesan building grant, which will allow us to completely replace all the external cladding, windows and doors around school over the summer break. This will allow us to modernise and upgrade the school's insulation and give each classroom wonderful new bi-fold or French doors to the outside! Mrs Riddell and the new Stewardship Squad in school have been busy writing our school's Climate Action plan and this overhaul of our glazing and cladding will make a massive impact on our school's energy usage. We have also been busy cutting our food waste and starting our own composting venture, to help keep our gardening club stocked with nourishment! We
